🧠 Account & Niche Setup

- ✓ Create a Pinterest Business Account
- ✓ Add a profile photo or logo
- ✓ Write a keyword-rich bio
- ✓ Claim your website or landing page
- ✓ Choose a profitable niche (with products + demand)
- ✓ Use Pinterest Trends to validate your niche

🔍 Find & Select Affiliate Products

- ✓ Join relevant affiliate networks (Amazon, ShareASale, ClickBank, etc.)
- ✓ Choose products that solve real problems
- ✓ Avoid promoting random or unrelated products

🎨 Pin Creation & Optimization

- ✓ Use Canva or Snappa to design tall vertical pins (1000x1500px)
- ✓ Add clear headlines + text overlay
- ✓ Use bold colors + high-quality images
- ✓ Include a strong CTA (Tap to Learn More, Grab Yours, etc.)
- ✓ Add SEO-friendly titles and descriptions
- ✓ Sprinkle in relevant keywords and hashtags

📌 Set Up Rich Pins

- ✓ Add meta tags to your site or page
- ✓ Use Pinterest's Rich Pin Validator
- ✓ Confirm approval—Rich Pins will activate automatically

🔗 Link & Disclose

- ✓ Add affiliate links (either direct or via landing page)
- ✓ Disclose with “#affiliate” or a disclaimer
- ✓ Avoid spammy or broken links

Board Optimization

- ✓ Create boards around your niche
- ✓ Write keyword-rich board titles + descriptions
- ✓ Add 5+ pins per board
- ✓ Regularly update and re-pin

Promote Your Pins

- ✓ Join group boards
- ✓ Schedule content with Tailwind
- ✓ Share pins on Instagram, Facebook, Twitter
- ✓ Test Pinterest Ads with small budgets

Track & Improve

- ✓ Use Pinterest Analytics to track saves, clicks, and outbound links
- ✓ Repin top-performing content
- ✓ Redesign or remove underperformers
- ✓ Test different pin styles to improve results

Bonus Tip

- ✓ Stay consistent. Pin regularly. Keep learning. One affiliate sale can turn into a stream of passive income when you treat Pinterest like a business, not a side scroll.
